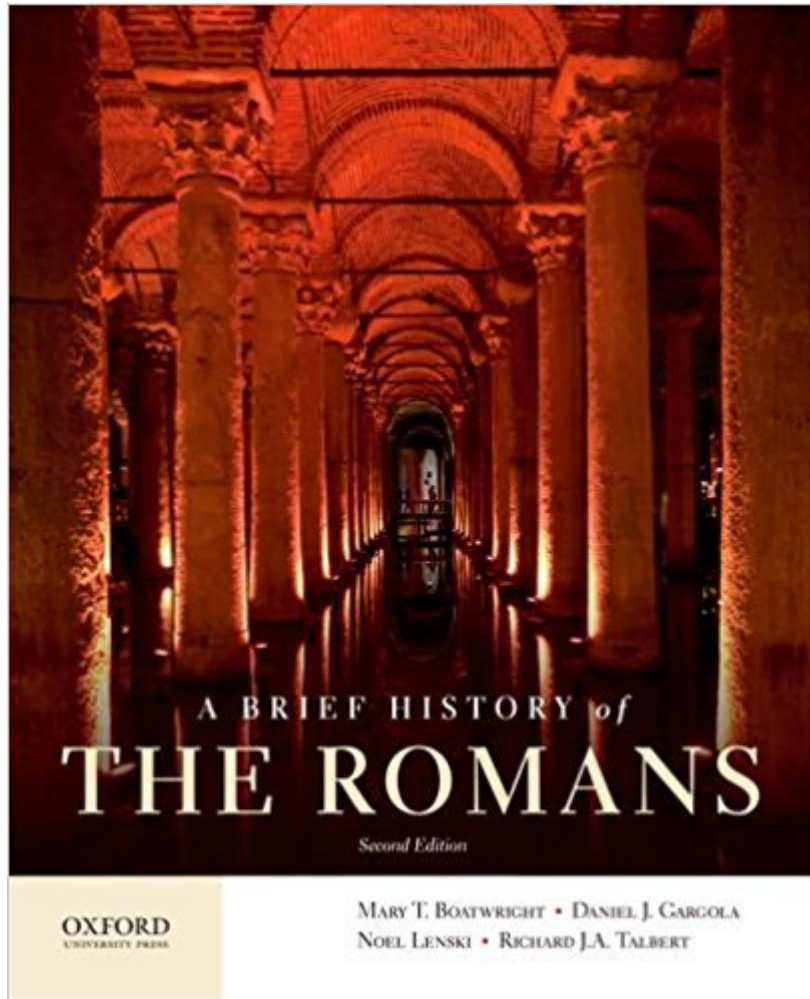

There is also a Companion Website that offers resources for students and instructors.

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
