

account of pervasive corruption. The book is a detailed report of the matter. It also has the merit of revealing some of the strategies used by the powerful to prevent justice running its course - obstruction, diversionary tactics, ad hominem attacks - when inconvenient truths kept emerging. A few of those involved served prison time, but the sad fact is that most escaped any legal or financial penalty.
