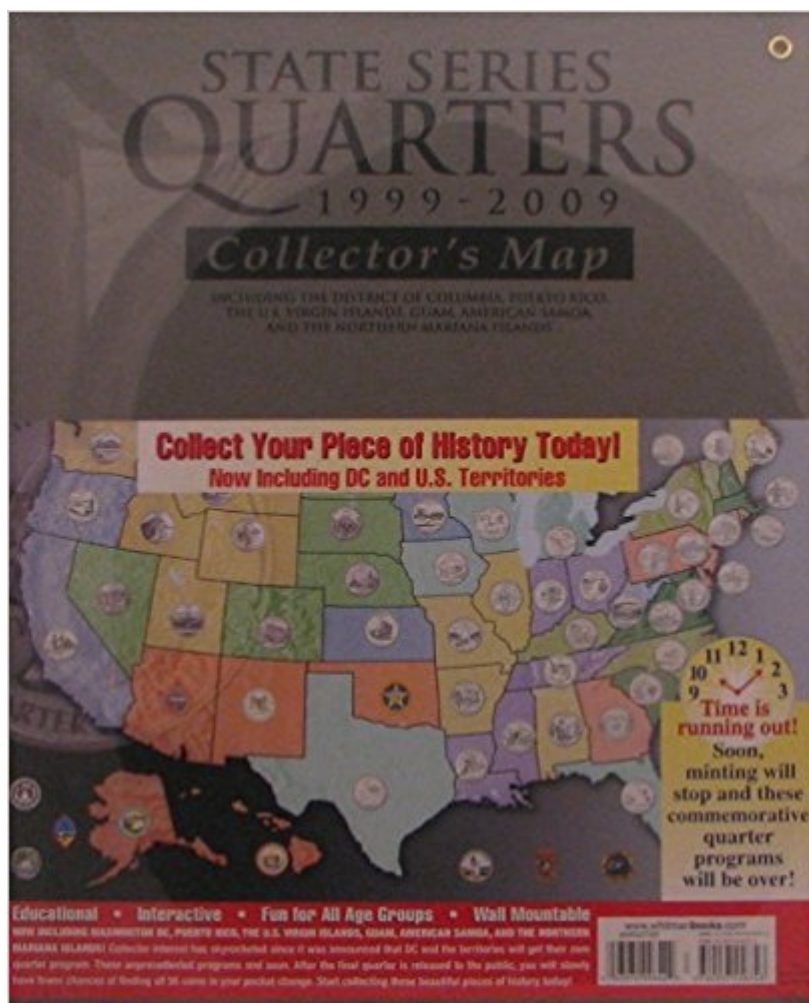

I bought this a few years back and then recently purchased another on . I have one in my classroom and have now started giving them as gifts to people who see mine and love the idea. This one is great, the states are in different colors so this is great for kids. With that said, it is great for adults too, as it doesn't look child-like; it is great for all ages. Once you put the quarter in though, it is tough to get out (you have to pry it out-though it is not impossible), so be sure that if kids are putting them in that you double check first that they are putting the quarter in the right location. Also, this particular map is the best I've seen, and I have seen another one that looks similar, but isn't this one; even when you look at the pictures, two different maps are shown...be sure you are buying the Whitman State Series listed since I notice there are more than one seller. Anyway, have fun, this is really a great purchase, nice quality, not too expensive, and something you could keep on a shelf or

display since the colors aren't too bright and it has a hole in the top corners so you could hang it.

My boyfriend is a transfer student and I bought him this to help him organize the quarters as he tries to collect them all. He had been taping them to the wall before, so when I found this map that would display them on the wall it was perfect. I'm quite pleased with it. I see other people have complained about getting the cardboard place-holders out of the map to put the quarters in. My suggestion is to use a sharp knife and patience. After a learning curve we were able to get them out without damaging the map or anything else (he wanted to keep the cardboard inserts for a separate project). We've not tried to remove any quarters we put in, so I can't vouch for that, but I suspect the knife would work just as well. Great for the money. Even if we don't find all the quarters it's a great way to display the rest of them. I'd recommend it.

Just received these (I bought two) and my 6 year old has scoured the house for all the quarters she can find. We're learning the dates each became a state, the seal of each state, and it even includes the American Territories which is a bit more learning. The folder is hard and durable and once the quarters go in, they're not coming out! (We tried). Incidentally we put a couple of National Park Quarters into the states without realizing they were National Park Quarters. So now I'm off to find a similar item to begin our collection of the National Park Quarters . . . and I need another one of these since my soon to be 3 year old would like her own too!

Sturdy and handsome folder for filing, organizing and displaying limited-edition commemorative state quarters. The folder itself is heavy, board-weight material which easily supports the weight of the quarter collection and can be used as a free-standing display of them. Inside the folder is a map of the contiguous 48 states, plus insets of the offshore states and territories. Each has a slot or slots designed to receive the state's or territory's special edition quarter[s] and makes filing and displaying them easy and handsome. The folder is well made and a bargain!

I needed a quarter map for awhile and researched to find the best one. I finally ordered this one and was pleasantly surprised when I received it. The colors are beautiful and the map is very sturdy. Once the quarters go in they are in for good. My kids and I (14, 11 and 8) all put the quarters in together and had a great time. Now I realize I only need 5 more states and 3 more territories. Before the map they were all in a bag in my dresser and everytime someone gave me a quarter I had to go and dig them all out if I wasn't sure whether I had it or not. This map also has hanging holes, which

will allow me to hang it on the wall once I have completed the map. Good product Whitman!!

My 5 year old son is very interested in geography and after losing his first tooth and getting quarters from the tooth fairy, he realized there are state quarters and immediately wanted to collect them all. So I came on here looking for something that would be easy for him to keep track of which states he had and also make a nice display piece for when it was full and this was perfect. Great price, great product. It came in the mail last night and he got all 27 of his quarters in it right away (with help from dad) and cannot wait to collect the remaining ones. We love it!

I was a bit surprised when I first received this map because it is much bigger than I expected, but that certainly means something cool for a collector if you want to show off your collection. The black background looks nice too. The quality of the paper is not that ideal when you are digging out the lids for coin spots. Also the spots for coins are originally filled with the state symbols, which makes me a bit sad to get them out. But after all it's a nice map.

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
