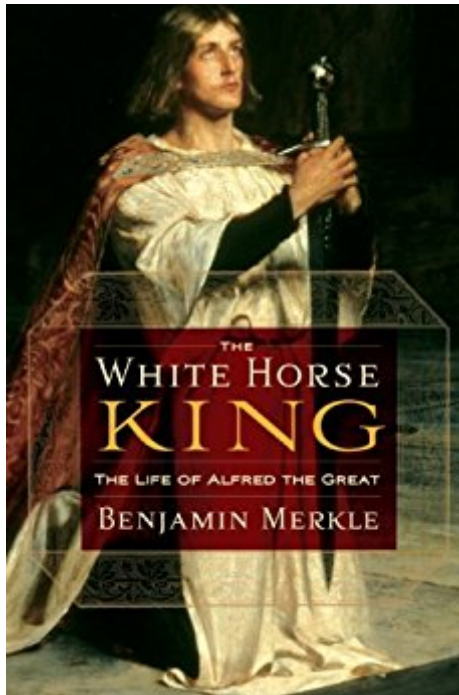

I enjoyed The Last Kingdom TV series on BBC America and was pleased to find how closely the series followed the history as presented in The White Horse King. The book is easy to read and for the most part moves quickly. Not a stodgy history book.

As one who knew little about this time period, I appreciate the information in this book. It was an informative and enjoyable read about a young man who set out to defend his nation against a barbaric threat, and in doing so inadvertently revived civilization, learning, law and order, and education. The Dark Ages were not nearly as dark as I had imagined, and lessons applicable in this age can be drawn from this era. A good read for anyone, not just fans of Britain's history.

However, the writing could have flowed better, and the battle descriptions seemed to all be cut out of the same cloth. The book was shorter than I anticipated. If you like history one could do worse than read this book. The descriptions of the King and his battles could have been more organized and not the "same old, same old".

There's not a lot of biographies about Alfred the Great, at least for e-readers. There is this jewel, however, that reads like a novel, partly because he had such an interesting and meaningful life. Growing up he never knew a time when his world wasn't being ravaged by Vikings, who regularly took slaves and destroyed everything in their wake. Everyone feared them, they seemed unstoppable. Their victims paid them the dane-geld just to go away, but that only worked for a short time. Alfred was pious but practical and forward-thinking. How he succeeded in ultimately stopping the Viking hordes from taking over the entire country is riveting reading, but he never rested on his laurels or stopped working for the betterment of his people. He truly was a great King..

This biography is so well written and entertaining, the reader can almost forget it is history rather than fiction. Alfred the Great's life is presented in richness and detail with no "dumbing down" and without turning into a pompous, boring, professorial lecture. Merkle has created the type of factual work that can turn anyone into a lover of history. I am so glad I fell prey to the whim and made this

part of my library. I'm even happier I read it now rather than let it sit until I had nothing else to read.

The Dark Ages were given light by Alfred the Great. To whom we owe our thanks and respect for establishing the ideal of city planning, the codified civil laws, and the defense of our country.
