

Reading and reflecting on the Gospel of Thomas has brought me to a more real and earthy Jesus, pared of the layers of Christology heaped on him over the years. The sayings are pithy and thought provoking, and sometimes unintelligible for me across so many generations. This is what one would expect. There are also many similarities with the canonical gospels. For many weeks I have been reading a saying each day and allowing it to sit with me. The commentary is not as detailed as I would have liked, but is often helpful in giving some background. However, I bought the book more for the translation. The discovery of this Gospel has been, and continues to be, a gift to those who wish to gain a deeper understanding of the human Jesus and also of the early church. Together with some of the other "apocryphal" gospels, I am able to get more of a picture of the diversity of the early churches and how much was lost when only one version of Christianity was allowed.

Davies provides a new fresh translation and just enough commentary to help the reader do their own pondering of the mystery sayings found in the Gospel of Thomas. The translation is certainly more readable than the SV (Scholars Version) which is more interested in the historical Jesus than it is in the Gospel of Thomas itself. Davies allows Thomas' Gospel to speak on its own terms, and in

doing so liberates for us another voice that witnesses to a part of the early church community. I found Davies' explanation of the two creations very helpful in understanding some of the logia in Thomas' Gospel. Sometimes, though, I found myself wishing for more commentary than is provided. For example, I hoped for more references to better understand the Greek and Coptic texts. Overall, though, this is a wonderful book for devotional meditation, for better understanding of, and a greater appreciation for this ancient gospel.

I like this book. This is one of two books on The Gospel of Thomas I bought. This book is a pleasure to read. The quotations are on one page and the interpretations are on the facing page. The interpretations are written in a style that I can understand, which gives me a realistic look into the sayings of Jesus.

The Gospel of Thomas is really an outstanding book, much better than I expected. The annotations and explanations of the mystical sayings of Jesus are very thought-provoking, giving a clear understanding of Thomas's message that the Kingdom of God is within you and not within the ornate churches. The Kingdom of Heaven is here and now and not a future threat. Professor Davies did an awesome job with his research.

The Gospel of Thomas is an important discovery, a treasure from the ancient desert. Stevan Davies makes a good translation, although I am not an expert in this category. Sometimes his commentary is excellent and insightful, opening new doors of possibility for the reader of Thomas.
