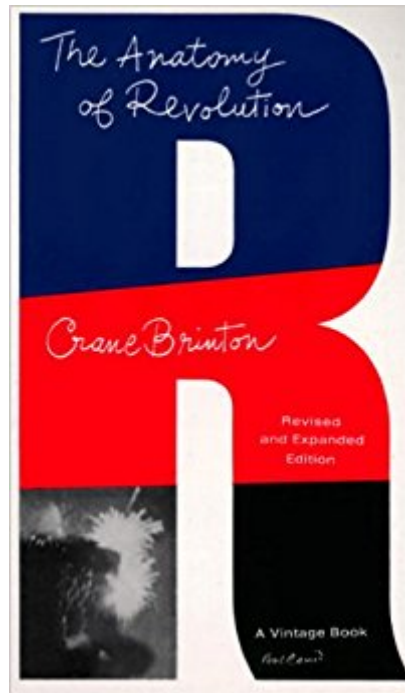




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The Anatomy Of Revolution

Crane Brinton (1898-1968) was an American historian of France who taught as a professor at Harvard University from 1942 until his death. Before securing a position as a professor at Harvard, Brinton studied there as a student and received a Rhodes Scholarship allowing him to attend Oxford University, where he received his doctorate in philosophy (1923). Brinton's most famed work was his *The Anatomy of Revolution* (1938). During his lifetime he served as the president of both the American Historical Association and the Society for French Historical Studies.

This was part of the required reading in a class I took in 1967. I thought it was the last word on the subject then. I recently took another class where this was in the reading list and took the opportunity

to re-read it. I was not as convinced on the second read. As another reviewer noted, there is a lot of squeezing to make the American, French and Russian revolutions fit in the same box. Also, a book on revolution that does not include such more recent events as China, Algeria and Cuba seems a little dated. Having said all that, it is the standard book on the subject, and anyone exploring the subject should read it since it still is the standard.
