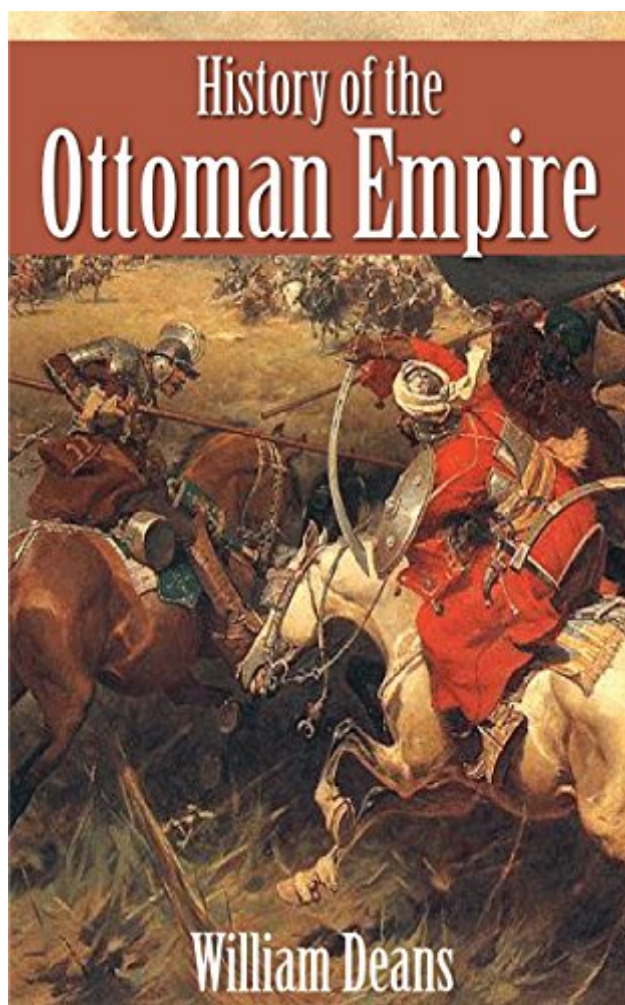

This is a book for history buffs, not for general knowledge. It is thoroughly researched to the early 1800s and presented in tedious detail to the point of buckling your knees.
