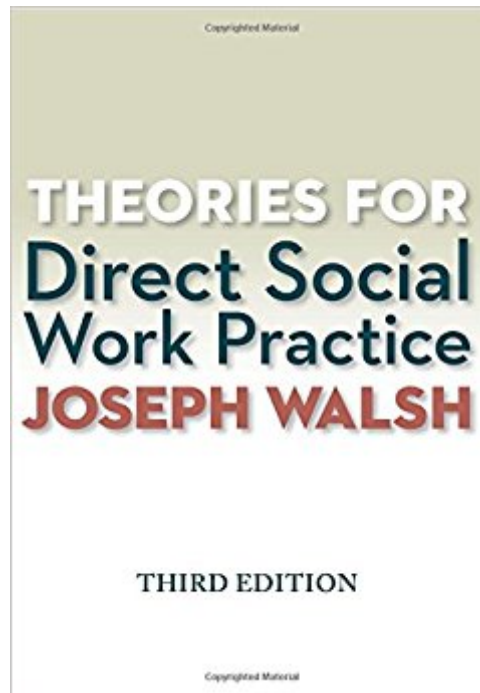

He has been a direct services practitioner in the field of mental health since 1974, first in a psychiatric hospital and later in community mental health center settings.
