

Understanding End Times Prophecy: A Comprehensive Approach



Synopsis

Many Christians think of end-times prophecy as a gigantic, intimidating puzzleâ "difficult to piece together and impossible to figure out. But every puzzle can be solved if you approach it the right way. Paul Benware compares prophecy to a picture puzzle. Putting the edge pieces together first builds the 'framework' that makes it easier to fit the other pieces in their place. According to Benware, the framework for eschatology is the biblical covenants. He begins his comprehensive survey by explaining the major covenants. Then he discusses several different interpretations of end-times prophecy. Benware digs into the details of the Rapture, the Great Tribulation, the judgements and resurrections, and the millennial kingdom. But he also adds a unique, personal element to the study, answering questions as: Why study bible prophecy? What difference does it make if I'm premillennial or amillennial? If what the Bible says about the future puzzles you, Understanding End Times Prophecy will help you put together the pieces and see the big picture.

I'm still slogging through it. I am PCA (thoroughly Reformed). I studied eschatology a long time ago, and I'm back to it now, teaching adult Sunday school class. This book (so far) treats Scripture as literal as one can (there are symbols in Revelation that maybe should not be interpreted literally). Between dispensational and covenantal theological approaches, dispensational is by far the most literal interpretative method. I don't say I'm dispensational. I believe the God's Word, whether I understand it all or not. I don't even know all that the theologians say, they don't agree, and they're not infallible. This book may be rehash of the enormous wealth of information out there. I'm very satisfied with it so far. Methodical, concise. Your interpretation of eschatology will depend on how you view the covenants/promises of God. He starts there with a brief overview.

Usually books on end times can seem a little intimidating. Some books try to avoid this by not using technical terms or cutting back on biblical proofs. This book does neither of those things. Benware helps you understand the terms associated with end times, and he gives clear, logical, biblical proofs to defend his position. This book takes the position that after the 7-year tribulation, Jesus will physically come to earth to establish a literal 1000-year kingdom over the world. He also argues that the Rapture of the Church will take place before the Tribulation. Whether you agree with this position or not, you should read this book to understand the arguments for this position and the arguments against other positions. Benware writes in a tone that is respectful of other views, but he makes a clear biblical defense for what he thinks the Bible teaches. A book like this is a must read for anyone who is interested in what the Bible says about end times (pastors, lay teachers, seminary students).

Comprehensive, thorough, fair. This book will be a good starter or finisher for one's studies about the end times. If one knows a lot about the second coming, he will find this to be a good wrap up to his studies. If one is a relative novice in end times studies, he will have a good primer for future study. Beware is clearly Pretrib by conviction, but he shows the strengths and weaknesses of most of the more traditional views fairly and respectfully.

This turned out to be an 'update' of an earlier edition of this book. If I had known this I would not have bought it because I don't think there would be enough 'update' to make it worth the purchase. BUT, if you do not have the earlier edition THIS WOULD BE FIVE STAR FOR YOU!!! It is an excellent book IF you did not already read it about six years ago.

For anybody who would like to know about interpreting the end times Biblically, and knowing the various views of eschatology this is a must read. The author obviously has his own eschatological perspectives (Pre-trib dispensationalism) but gives a fair and thorough representation of all of the views. The writer lays the basic foundations first then builds from there, showing the reader the history and the arguments that the supporters of each of the views give. There is a lot of talk about and interest in the end times these days. With so many theories floating around this is a must read for anyone who is interested in truly knowing end times prophecy.
