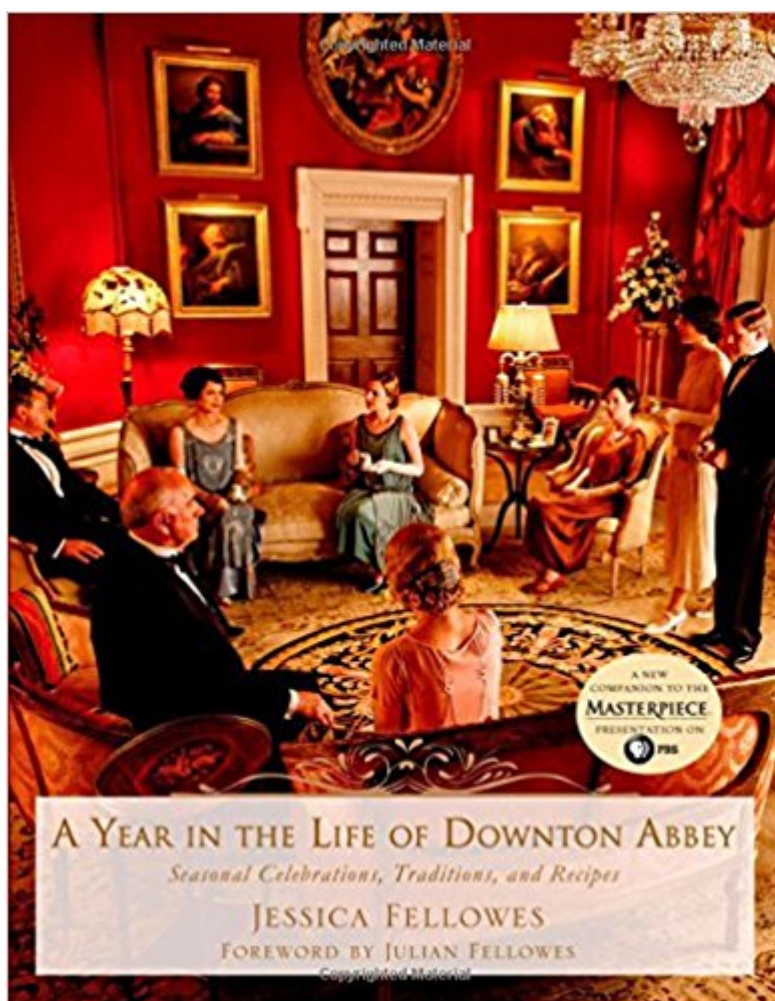

I came very late to the Downton Abbey phenomenon as I watched the series finale and then purchased the entire series and binge watched it (twice!). I purchased this book and the "Celebrations" book at the same time and basically read them as I was watching the show for the first time. It went a long way in helping me to understand the characters, and why some things were done then as they were. It is a beautiful book with thick glossy pages and colored pictures. Any spoilers did not bother me at all. It is a beautiful book with lots of information for the Downton fan....both for those who watched it every week when it was on air, and for those of us who missed out at first but became a serious fan at the end.

I bought this as a Christmas present. Of course I looked through it before I wrapped it, and was surprised to find that it was more of a summary of the series than it was a cookbook, which I had thought it was. It did have some recipes in it, and I actually wanted to try several of them, but I was disappointed that there were so few. However, the person I gave it to loved it so I was pleased that I had gotten it for her.
