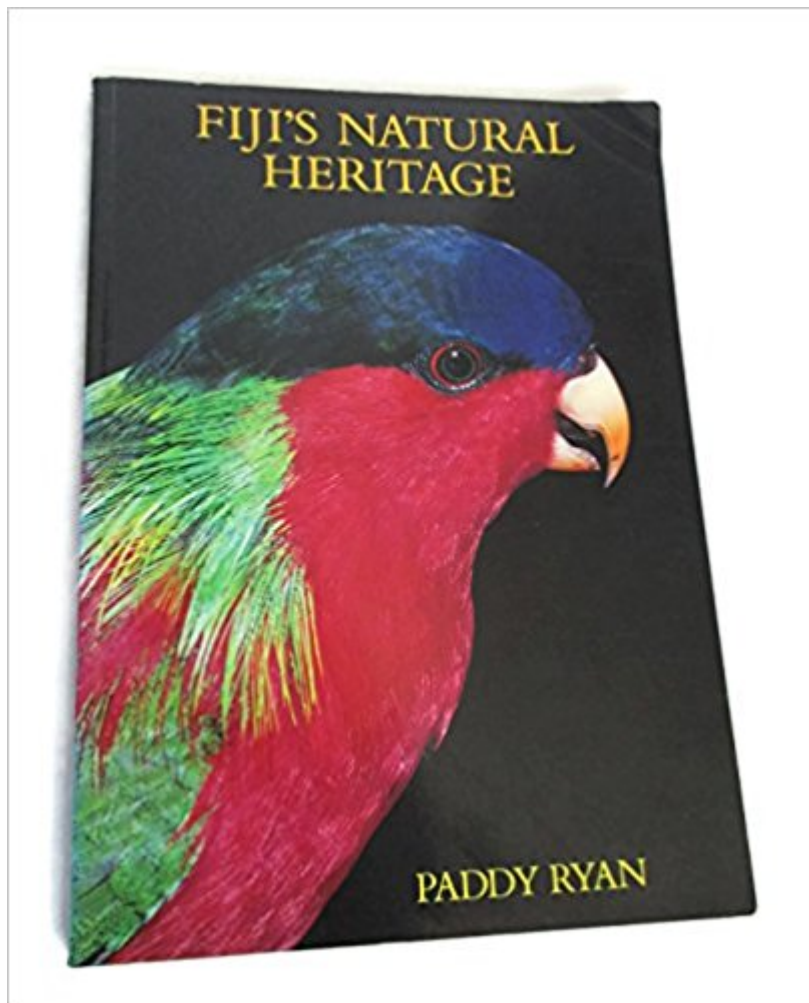


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# Fiji's Natural Heritage



## Synopsis

Paddy Ryan's text is packed with fascinating biological facts and features, as well as many engaging anecdotes detailing encounters with his subjects including the grey reef shark, the crested and the banded iguana, the fiddler crab (which signals frantically to potential mates with its enlarged chela or claw), the frigate bird (an aerial pirate), and Fiji's national flower, the tagimaucia. This book is filled with color photos of common sites that tourists see and those that are rarely seen. These are the categories

covered: Coral Worms Mollusks Echinoderms Crustaceans Insects Fish Amphibia Reptiles Birds Mammals Plants The Fijians Places to visit The commentary is thorough and detailed. The one to four photos per page serve to see what the text is talking about. This is the South Sea tropics at their best. I saw just a few samples of several of these categories in my tour of the islands. Most of what you see in the book is not readily visible even if it is in close proximity. If you are looking for photos of the islands and the beautiful water that surrounds them, you need a different book.

Fiji's Natural Heritage was the first comprehensive book on Fiji Natural History ever published. Paddy was fortunate enough to spend a great deal of time in Fiji as a child when his father worked there as a meteorologist. He has a special feel for Fiji and there's no doubt it occupies a special place in his heart. I believe the quality of his work is reflected in his visceral connection to the place. He once told me that the book was "highly recommended by Sir David Attenborough"--an accolade that he justifiably is quite proud of. You don't get a better endorsement than from Sir David.
